CSA Report

Timothy Capone's response to the Public Comments from the January 7, 2020 Board of Education Meeting.

Anthony Mastroeni, President of Montague Little League requested approval for Winter Clinics.

> Approved and went well with no issues.

Caitlin Borras- Stated students with IEPs pulled from classes. Special Education students are a distraction to other students, hard for teachers to do what they do.

Mr. Capone's Response:

➢ Her comments are offensive and discriminatory.

Kathy Ganska came to the Montague Township School for the holiday party on December 20. She was not approved. Claims the denial came from another parent. Mr. Capone's Response:

- That was not true as she was not approved as a parent chaperone and therefore couldn't join the class party.
- Mr. Capone had a meeting with Mrs. Ganska where she denied the information and was concerned about the coffee cart was a disruption to the educational process and as to why it was provided by the PTA. Mr. Capone polled the staff and not one staff member believed the coffee cart to be a disruption.
- What is the issue with the PTA? Statement from the PTA Audit Committee that an incident occurred in April where the Executive Board had to audit fundraisers where Kathy Ganska was the chairperson. Money was unaccounted for. The PTA made the executive decision to take the books and financial documents from her and wait until the new treasurer can start in July. Not a question if money was missing, only how much was missing.

Nick Dalacio- Why is our superintendent in the press so much when good things are happening in the school?

Mr. Capone's Response:

- > Unethical reporter whom doesn't research with his articles.
- For example, the recent story with Jamie Lemelledo January 27, 2020. Reporter Eric Obernauer did not include the entire set of allegations in the letter.

Jamie Lemelledo- On September 23 she received a letter in the mail outlining repeated disorderly conduct at the school and violating school safety protocols. She says it is a false accusation and vendetta against her.

Mr. Capone's Response:

- ➢ Google Jamie Lemelledo and disorderly conduct.
- Mr. Capone addressed Eric Obernauer. regarding the article highlighting Jamie and her response to letter sent to her from the school. "Did you do the due diligence on the article, do you know who you are quoting, or you take any random statement from them, did you vet your sources?
- In response to mold at the Montague Township School, Mr. Capone stated that there is no evidence of mold. The Sussex County Health Department was at the Montague Township school in November 2019 following the allegation.

John Mannion stated that the NJ Herald is a trusted source of news in Sussex County. Mr. Capone's Response:

- Last article outrageous number of false statements.
- Mr. Capone questions the reporter Eric Obernauer., "Did you do your due diligence and conduct a review of student records?" Mr. Obernauer did not respond.

Moving forward, Mr. Capone stated that he will respond to comments from public session during this time at the Board of Education meetings.

There were two recognitions:

Linda Willeford Teacher of the Year and Danielle La Starza, as Educational Service of the Year.

Mrs. Linda Willeford is a Model Teacher- children succeed knows their teacher cares about them and inspires them daily through engaging activities. Mrs. Willeford is a Vice President of the PTA and most deserving of this recognition.

Danielle La Starza adapts quickly, multitask, social worker, residency worker, truancy officer, anti-bullying specialist and she is an integral part of preparing students for high school. She also is involved in case managing, overseeing IEP, student evaluations and address truancies among other responsibilities.
