The Montague Township School District has announced it has information available for citizens interested in running for a vacant seat on the Montague Township Board of Education.

Michael Bussow, the Montague Township Board Secretary, announced today that the Montague Township Board of Education will have two (2), three-year terms open for the November 5, 2024 Annual School Election.

Candidates must file a nominating petition with the Office of the Sussex County Clerk, Board of Elections, located at 83 Spring Street, Suite 305, Newton, NJ 07860 to get their name on the ballot for the Annual School Election. The deadline to submit the nominating petition is Monday, July 29, 2024 before 4:00 p.m.. The election is scheduled for Tuesday, November 5, 2024.
